

**HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMITTEE  
MINUTES**

January 27, 2011  
12:30 PM

In attendance were: Dr. Luther Sowers, Lois Miller, June Frick, Lee Davis, Turk Pierce and Mickey Monson with Angie Liddick representing the Township and Jim Williams, interested citizen.

The November Minutes were motioned approved by Lee and Lois seconded; motion passed. Angie reported no demolition permits issued.

Under Old Business: The Committee discussed options for the memorial for Mrs. Imes. It was decided to allow Angie to meet with Dave Wendel concerning a bench and plaque in Fayfield Park which is close to the site of Mrs. Imes' family (Dietz) home and blacksmith shop. Re: Historic district signs, Mickey reported that they are halfway done. The preservation ordinance from Teri Johnescu has not been received yet. Mickey was asked to email her about this. We are in receipt of a lovely thank-you note from Mrs. Johnescu for the Committee's support.

June phoned Historic York during the meeting to ascertain a time frame for nominating Nick Kocoronis for their annual Preservation Award. She was given the date of April 1<sup>st</sup> to file nominations. The Committee felt a letter should be sent to Mr. Kocoronis to tell him of our intent and that, unless we hear from him within ten days with any objections, we hope to go forward with this plan. Mickey and Angie will work on this.

Under New Business: The Committee welcomed Mr. Jim Williams, of the firm of Williams & Ports Architecture and Design. Mr. Williams is interested in the Committee's work and possible membership. The Committee inquired concerning Mr. Williams' architectural background and projects. He counts among his projects the York Arts Building, the Meadowbrook Barn (former home of Pfaltzgraff Pottery Outlet) and the NuTec Barn of the former Heindel Farm on Concord Rd. He participated in the discussion of the Township farmhouse, recently targeted by our Committee for advocacy. Despite having no uniquely outstanding features for a late 19<sup>th</sup> C farmhouse, he felt it was probably in as good a shape structurally as the Township administration building. He was also told how to apply for committee membership, if that should be his desire.

An oil painting of the Stallman mansion -- "Macelyn" (originally on the current site of Walgreen's/Fudrucker's) was presented to the Township by Mr. Harry A. Brown Jr. through June Frick. An article to expand on its history is also donated and will be copied for display by June. Mickey will have copies made of pictures of the last building of Crandall's Health School on E. Market just beyond Stonewood Rd. These were offered by Mrs. Jutta Creager. Mickey will send thank-you notes to both Mr. Brown and Mrs. Creager.

Meeting was adjourned by *fiat*.
