OCTOBER 25, 2012  
MEETING MINUTES

In attendance were Dr. Luther Sowers, Mickey Monson, Lois Miller, June Frick and Turk Pierce of the committee; Jim Williams, AIA, interested citizen; and Angela Liddick representing the township.

The September minutes, as amended, were approved on a motion by Mickey and a second by June. The names of potential donors were struck from the minutes.

No demolition permits were issued since June. It was pointed out that the building under construction on Industrial highway near Wolf Furniture will house both the Social Security center and the IRS.

Mickey checked with Andy Gentzler of the township and reported both Olde East York signs were in the township's possession, but had not been erected because the final location has not been determined.

Dr. Sowers reported he was at the committee's booth at Saturday in the Park Sept. 29 from noon-3 p.m., after Lee Davis was there in the morning. There were two signs identifying the booth, but the banner could not be found. June said the committee's stuff has been moved again and we can't find everything.

Dr. Sowers said he and Mickey have not had a chance to contact potential donors for the purchase of the Schultz House. A copy of the covenants which a prospective buyer of the house would have to agree to was obtained by the committee after the meeting. This copy had been given to the township by Carol Tanzola, president of the Friends of Camp Security. The Schultz House and Camp Security, a prisoner-of-war camp for captured British soldiers, date to the Revolutionary War.

Mickey had an article in which the York County Heritage Trust commended the township and our committee for acquiring the Camp Security property.

Mickey also had a copy of a blog about the Pleasureville Historic District, which included the "Hermit House" at the junction of Pleasant Valley and Alpine roads. This house, which for years was occupied by a hermit and had been allowed to fall into disrepair, has been remodeled and is very attractive.

June volunteered to arrange for the Christmas lunch to be held Dec. 20 and it was decided to go to the newly-remodeled Paddock on Market St.
