**1. CALL TO ORDER**

**DVORYAK** Chairman Dvoryak called the Public Hearing to order. The purpose of the Public Hearing was the transfer of a Pennsylvania Liquor License.

**2. NEW BUSINESS**

A. Transfer of Pennsylvania Restaurant Liquor License No. R-19061 from 117 Frederick Street, Hanover, PA to 1500 Mt. Zion Road; York Galleria Mall pad site; corner of Whiteford and Mt. Zion Roads (Red Robin)

**DVORYAK** Chairman Dvoryak asked Attorney Jeff Lobach for his representation.

**LOBACH** Attorney Jeff Lobach introduced himself as a lawyer with Barley Snyder, 100 East Market Street, York. He stated he had been a township resident for 27 years. He was present with Jim Ryan, CEO of Lehigh Valley Restaurant Group, the applicant. Lehigh Valley operates 20 Red Robin restaurants. He hoped the board had visited one in the eastern half of Pennsylvania. It is a casual dining concept with a family-friendly atmosphere with only 7-1/2 percent of sales going to alcohol.

Attorney Lobach stated that Lehigh Valley operates 20 of the Red Robins restaurants, and with this addition, would be 21. The board had approved the Land Development Plan submitted by the Galleria Mall during April, and the plan

is working its way through the last of the administrative hurdles. The site would be located at the Y in the ring road that goes into Red Robin. The restaurant is known for its high quality food, its excellent service and it has been 100% compliant in every respect with Pennsylvania's liquor laws and has never had one violation. Red Robin has been in business for almost 21 years. He explained that, as a restaurant, the Franchisee of Red Robin operates the community restaurants. They were the first in the area to adopt the table top ziosk computer. That technology is now being adopted throughout the country, but they have had it for almost two years. He noted that Jim Ryan brought menus for the board's review of the food offerings and the pricing. He added that in each of the markets that they serve, they are very involved in the community, work with local charities and local governments. He offered to respond to questions.

**SCHENCK** Mr. Schenck commented that their application was extremely complete, more complete than what he was use to seeing. He indicated he was not surprised and was quite comfortable with everything that had been provided. He did not need any further testimony. He stated that procedurally the item would be acted upon during the public meeting at 7 p.m.

**3. PUBLIC COMMENT**

There were no public comments.

**4. ADJOURNMENT**
