**1. CALL TO ORDER**

**SWOMLEY** Chairman Swomley called the Public Hearing to order. He stated the purpose of the Public Hearing was to hear of a transfer request for a restaurant liquor license.

**2. NEW BUSINESS**

**A.** Transfer of Restaurant Liquor License to 1747 Beer & Wine, LLC (Rutter's), 160 North Hills Road

**HEIM** Attorney Larry Heim, 345 East Market Street, York, PA represented the owner. He stated that this is an application for approval of an inner-municipal transfer. This township, along with nearly every municipality, is over quota, and the Liquor Code requires a Public Hearing first before an application for approval can be filed.

The applicant is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Rutter's and every employee in the farm operation stores will be RAMP certified and trained for a responsible alcohol management program. Hours of operation will be that, which is permitted by the

Liquor Code from Monday through Saturday 7 a.m. until 2 a.m. the next day;  
Sunday from 9 a.m. to 2 a.m. on Monday.

The area where the beer will be stored in coolers will be secured when the alcohol is not permitted to be sold. There will be an extended Sunday Sales Permit, since the store is open 24/7. When sales are permitted, that area where you can buy beer is closed off, and the beer area is locked.

Take out will be sold at the legal limit of 192 fluid oz. which is two six-packs of 16 oz. or 6 quarts in any single transaction. Single bottles or cans maximum of 16 oz. may be purchased and consumed on the premises.

Rutter's preference would be to not permit consumption on premises. If no consumption is permitted, then the store is not a dispenser. Only one drink on premises will be permitted. Food service is offered, and there will be seats for 30 and furnished booths for 30, which is not a problem. Only beer will be sold in the beer cooler, no dairy products.
