

## Historic Preservation Open Forum

**What:** An open forum to gather information from the community about what role the Township should play in helping to preserve local historic properties.

The Township would like to take this opportunity to share with the community its current processes regarding these types of properties. All are welcome to attend.

The open house-like event is scheduled to begin at 5:30pm with a brief opening statement describing the goals for the evening with information stations available throughout the building. The opening statement will be announced again at 6:30pm and 7:30pm, so please feel free to arrive at any time.

Information stations will be set up to discuss a variety of topics. Topics may include: the Springettsbury Township Historic Preservation Committee, the current procedures the Township has in place regarding historic properties, the laws available to the Township to preserve properties; as well as information about the National Register of Historic Places, the Pennsylvania Bureau for Historic Preservation, and what the local community believes the role the Township government should have in historic preservation.

Over 500 surveys were sent out to property owners who currently appear on the Township's list of the top 100 historic sites or who have property within the East York or Pleasureville Historic Districts. Surveys will also be available at the meeting for the general public.

The Township hopes to have data available from the forum to present to the Board of Supervisors prior to the end of 2013. Pending the outcome of this event, the Township would like to hold similar events in the future.

Citizens are encouraged to attend to learn about local historic preservation and share thoughts on the subject.

**Please Note:** No decisions, specific codes or ordinances will be made, voted on or debated at this forum. This is a fact gathering meeting held to benefit both the Township and the community on historic preservation.
