HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

The Historic Preservation Committee has the power to review and make recommendations to the Board on policies and procedures relating to historic preservation and documentation of sites, structures, and activities that have occurred in the Township.

The Committee presented the Board of Supervisors with a list of the 100 most historically significant sites in 2001. All resources on this list were designated as Class I sites by the committee. Along with this list, the Committee presented a classification system that was utilized to determine the historical significance of each site. This system includes four class designations for historic resources.

SPRINGETTSBURY TOWNSHIP'S HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

- Established through the adoption of Ordinance 2003-18
- Seven members are appointed on an annual basis by the Board of Supervisors
- All members must be residents of the Township for their entire term

DEMOLITION DELAY PERIOD

Currently, the Township has a demolition delay period with a requirement to perform a historic resource impact study for any proposals that qualify as a subdivision or land development. These measures do not prevent demolition of historic resources, but do give the opportunity for the Historic Resource Committee to document and photograph historic resources before they are redeveloped.
